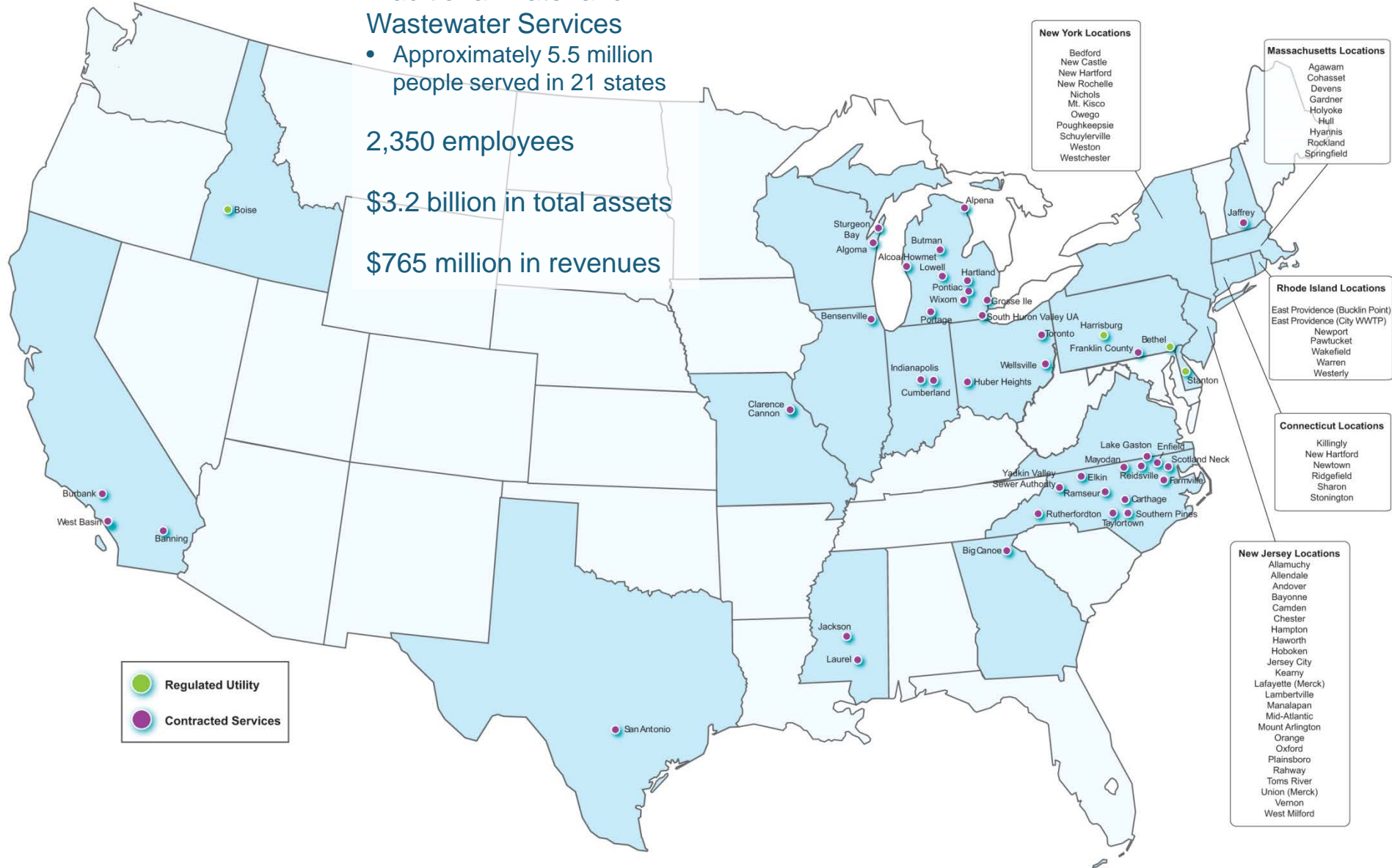
## Traditional Water and Wastewater Services

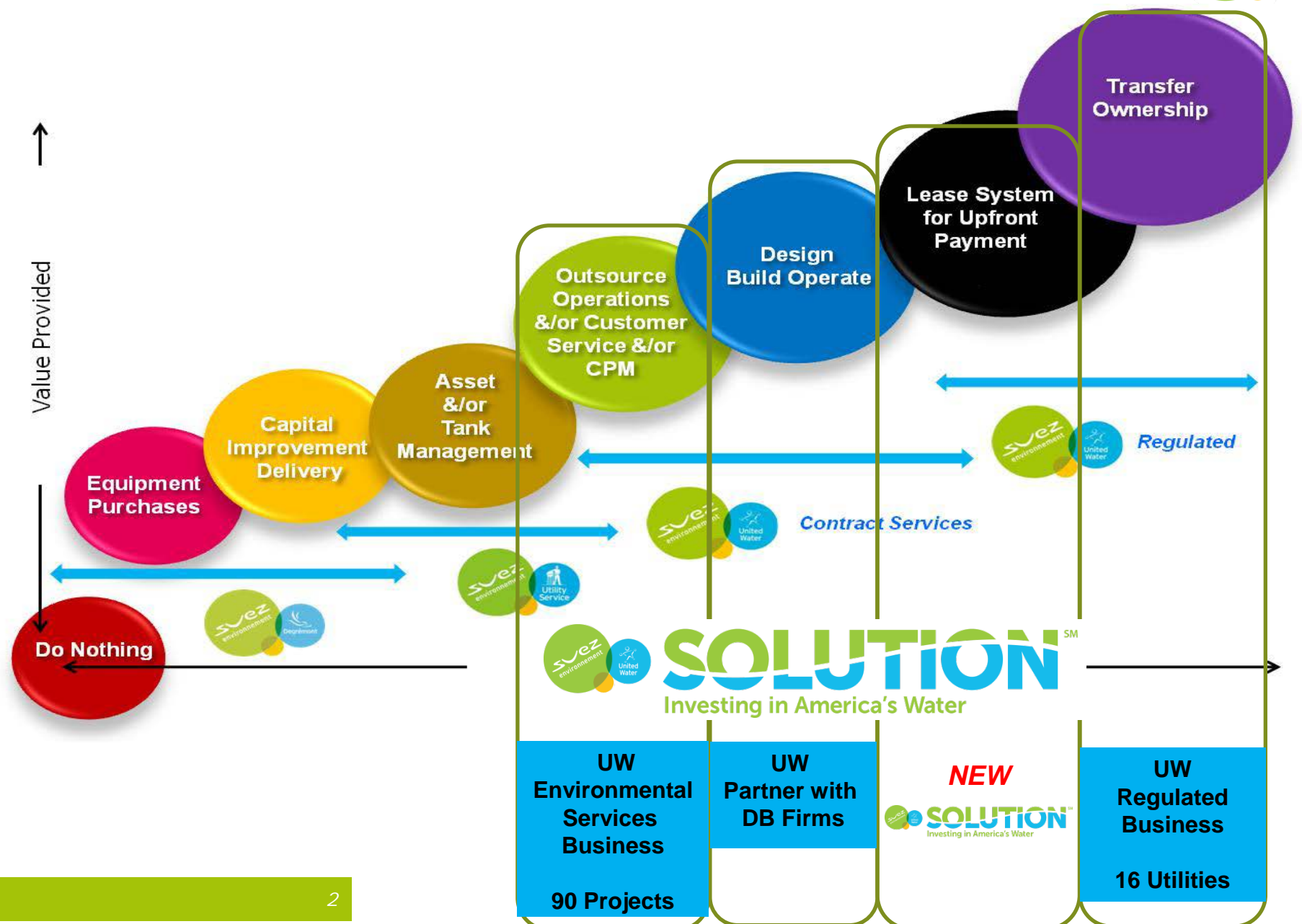

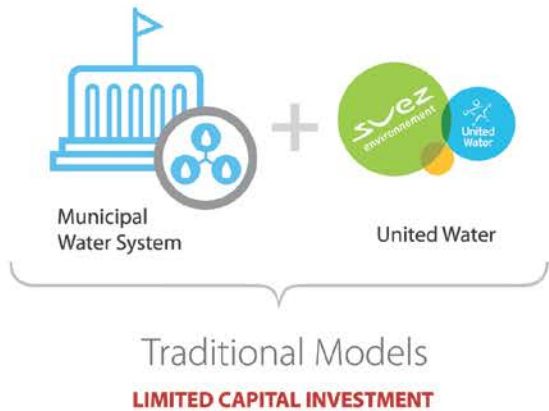
